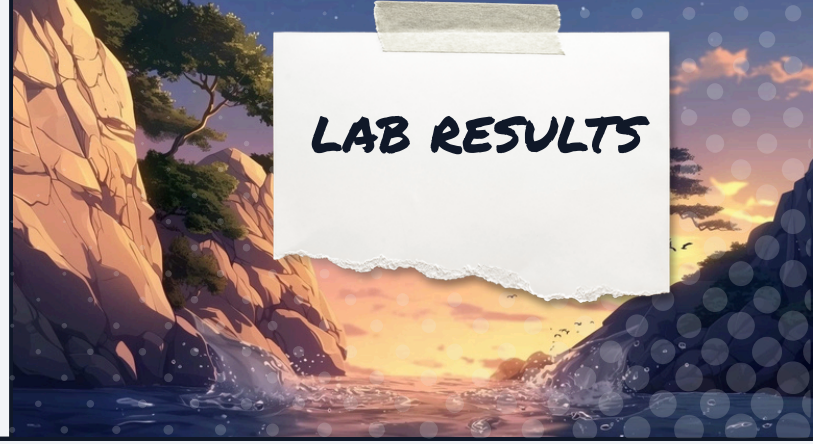


Reimagining Jesus

Key scripture:

Whenever crowds came to Him, He had compassion for them because they were so deeply distraught, malaised, and heart-broken. They seemed to Him like lost sheep without a shepherd.

[37] Jesus understood what an awesome task was before Him, so He said to His disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. [38] Ask the Lord of the harvest to send more workers into His harvest field."

Big idea:

Jesus is often misrepresented as a dry or lifeless symbol. We need to reimagine him; he was a people scientist who he transformed those he met. The world needs us to follow his example.

Application:

We can become spiritual and powerful people scientists like Jesus was. Here's what he did and what we can do too:

- Open our eyes to understand people.
- Act with compassion on what we see.
- Read people spiritually rather than focusing on their behavior.
- Live with love that comes from God.

Becoming a Christian isn't adopting a moral code; it's entering a relationship with God that rewires our hearts from the inside out and turns us into people scientist.
